



Bob White, CCIM Georgia Chapter Scholarship Program Guidelines 1/1/10

Background

The Bob White CCIM Scholarship honors Bob White CCIM as Founding Member. He is honored for his dedication, commitment, outstanding achievement and service in the commercial real estate and investment area.

The Georgia Chapter has committed to fund one Bob White scholarships for 2010. This scholarship award shall be in the amount of \$1,000 annually.

The scholarship application forms are due by **October 31st, 2010** and the check will be cut November 15th.

Chapter requirements:

1. Scholarship criteria submitted for review/approval by the Education Foundation.
2. The recipient will be a Georgia State University student and will be selected by the Head of the Real Estate department.
3. Russell Malayery CCIM will initially serve as the Foundation liaison to be the primary point of contact with the Education Foundation and the scholarship committee.
4. Georgia State University Real Estate department will collect eligible applications from potential recipients and select one (1) or two (2) scholarship recipients annually based on the selection criteria. The scholarship recipient information will be submitted to the Georgia CCIM Scholarship Chair no later than October 31st of each year.
5. The scholarship will be awarded at a regular chapter function and a brief summary and photo of award presentation to student will be submitted to the Foundation.
6. The Chapter will assign a mentor for each scholarship recipient and guide the recipient through CCIM designee process.
7. The Chapter will provide a head shot and scholarship documentation of recipient to the Foundation.

SCHOLARSHIP PURPOSE

The purpose of the scholarship is to assist Georgia CCIM candidates by offsetting the cost of CI core classes, excluding CI 101, offered by the Georgia Chapter.

Applicant Eligibility & Selection Criteria:

The selection shall primarily be based on merit, including the following factors:

- Applicant must be a full-time student (graduate or undergraduate at the time of application at GSU).
- Applicant must submit an application including noteworthy accomplishments related to the commercial real estate industry, community and professional volunteer service.
- Applicant will submit a written statement about career goals, importance of the scholarship, etc.
- Applicant must have be committed to obtaining the CCIM designation.
- Demonstrate good communication skills.
- Provide a history of employment
- Provide personal and professional references.
- Demonstrates willingness to advance in commercial real estate and a passion for community service and can provide evidences of service given.
